### **ACTC REQUEST**

The Assistance Center gives out almost 500 brown bag lunches a month to our homeless clients. Sandwich supplies are kept at the Center and volunteers often fill the gap by preparing peanut butter and jelly, cheese and balogna or meat sandwiches (Chipolte provides the meat). It would be a great help if we can have some prepared snack bags (brown bags) containing some non-perishable items to be kept on hand to add to our sandwiches and make a complete lunch. We prefer to make the sandwich as we need them so that they will be fresh. Perhaps this can be a service project for your Sunday School classes or Vacation Bible Schools.

Here are some examples of items in a snack bag: 2 or 3 items are sufficient

- Small bag of chips/pretzels/goldfish
- Sealed fruit cup
- Juice box or bag (optional) ACTC always has water bottles available
- Sealed pack of cookies or granola bar

Items can be placed in a brown lunch bag. Feel free to include a word of encouragement and/or Bible verse in your bags.
